Follow-up to the Annual Meeting

Those present at the annual meeting will remember there were presentations by City of East Lansing Director of Public Works Scott House and East Lansing School Superintendent Dori Leyko.

Scott House provided information about the 'Water Service Line Survey,' which all Red Cedar residents are strongly encouraged to complete, and the

'Service Line Replacement Pilot," a city initiative looking for 60 households with galvanized or lead lines to volunteer to test their water. Contact 517-337-9459 for details on either.



Superintendent Leyko provided updates about the future of the Red Cedar Elementary School building and laid out the timeline for school transitions, with Red Cedar continuing to serve as the "swing school" while other elementary school buildings are renovated. She also acknowledged the hard work being done by the Red Cedar Commission, which includes some School Board Members and local parents of elementary school-aged children, whose mandate it is to determine a path forward for long-term programming at Red Cedar. The commission is looking at many innovative possibilities and planning to conduct a survey of East Lansing residents soon.
