Proposal 2 & City Parking Meeting

On October 4, the RCCA will host an information meeting at the University Lutheran Church for interested residents to learn about and discuss two topics.

First, a representative from the organization **Voters Not Politicians** will offer an information session to members of our community interested in learning about Proposal 2, which will appear on the ballot in November. Proposal 2 would create an Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission and end the practice of Gerrymandering in Michigan.

Then, **East Lansing Director of Public Works Scott House** will be present to discuss the proposed changes to on-street parking in East Lansing, a topic that directly influences many Red Cedar Neighborhood residents.

Community Open House

Glencairn (Red Cedar) Reading Scores Highest in Area

The *Lansing State Journal* recently reported on last year’s M-TEST test scores. Ingham, Eaton, and Clinton county schools posted results that ranged widely, and between individual schools within the same district, test scores varied greatly. The students’ of Glencairn Elementary—the student body currently studying at Red Cedar—rose to the top of the list.

Approximately 87% of third-grade test-takers at East Lansing’s **Glencairn Elementary** scored proficient on the English portion of the M-STEP, **the highest of any school in Ingham, Eaton and Clinton counties.**

East Lansing Seeks School Crossing Guards, Substitutes

Adult School Crossing Guards provide safe crossings for schoolchildren at designated crosswalks within the City of East Lansing.
